Our 2nd Faith Climate Action Day will take place on **Wed.**, **Mar. 29, 2023**. **Activities will begin with a news conference at 11:30 a.m. in the Cedar Creek room at the State House**, followed by opportunities to speak with representatives about critical climate-related legislation while demonstrating how our faith motivates our resolve to create a livable climate for future generations. "The climate crisis is fueled by "bad banks" loaning massive amounts of funds to the fossil fuel industry. The four largest offending banks are Chase, Citibank, Wells Fargo, and Bank of America. Join Third Act Vermont in our campaign to end this climate-destroying funding of fossil fuels. Tuesday, March 21, 3:30 – 5:00 pm, Chase Bank, at the top of Church Street Marketplace, 1 Church St, Burlington. Please come and bring your signs; see ideas at Third Act.. (Spare

signs will be available on site.) We will march down Church Street and back, then gather in front of the bank for some introductory remarks, skits, a credit card cutting ceremony, and music."

World Water Day is March 22! Clean Water & Sanitation: Faith Action on U.N. SDGs

We are grateful to our friends at Yale Forum on Religion and Ecology (FORE) for their work and this story. "Beginning in 2020, and in

collaboration with UNEP's Faith for Earth Initiative, the Yale Forum on Religion and Ecology, United Religions Initiative, and Parliament of the World's Religions created the online database, 'Faith Action on the UN Sustainable Development Goals' (SDGs). This vibrant and growing resource documents environmental action taken by faith-based organizations, religious communities, and Indigenous groups worldwide." Related to the U.N.
