VTIPL's Faith Climate Action Day a Success! VTIPL is very pleased to report that our second Faith Climate Action Day of advocacy at the State House was a success. This was largely thanks to the leadership of VTIPL Board member Richard Butz, and key event partners VPIRG and Vermont Interfaith Action. The Lobby Day in

Montpelier on March 29 began with a press conference when several VTIPL members spoke, starting with President Ron McGarvey explaining why people of faith have a particular responsibility to work on behalf of Creation. VTIPL Vice-President Pr. Nancy Wright offered an opening Earth-based prayer. VTIPL Coordinator Donna Roberts spoke about the recent U.N. IPCC report on the urgent state of the climate and the critical opportunity to act NOW linking the global report to legislative priorities in Vermont. Board member Harris Webster shared about his personal environmental commitment invoking words of Greta Thunberg from her new publication, *The Climate Book*.

Richard Butz spoke about the specific legislation we were at the State House to support including the Affordable Heat Act and the Renewable Energy Standard. We were also joined by Representative Mari Cordes and Representative Caleb Elder both of whom are instrumental in creating and supporting climate-friendly legislation.

Faith Climate Action Week starts today. This year's theme is, *Living the Golden Rule: Just Transition to a Clean Energy Economy*. We hope you've had time to access the Organizer's Kit containing many helpful resources to help congregation and communities create

meaningful events and make the faith-climate connection. Materials include an updated **climate change fact sheet**, faith-based discussion materials, and ideas for local action. The free digital Organizer's Kit is still available. <u>Download Kit.</u> Included in the Kit are:

Earth Day & Climate-focused Faith Community Services & Events

and First Unitarian Universalist Society of Burlington are among the many faith-based communities in our region celebrating Earth Month with special activities.

On Sunday, April 16, from 2:30-5 p.m., Dayenu Dartmouth in Hanover, NH, presents the workshop, *Confronting the Climate Crisis and Cultivating Spiritual Courage*. The interactive activity is part of an emerging field of climate spiritual adaptation work, anchored in practices from *The Work that Reconnects* by Joanna Macy. Grounded in Jewish wisdom, song, and courageous conversations, the hybrid in-person and virtual workshop will be held at Dartmouth's Roth Center. "Spurred to action through a calling to care for God's Creation and an obligation to preserve it for future generations, the Church's Climate Action Group (CAG) was formed in 2018.

Emphasizing concrete Action and Advocacy and by supporting education of ourselves, our church and our community, the CAG focuses on raising

awareness of the climate crisis and taking decisive steps to help mitigate it." VTIPL held its 2022 Spring Conference on *Limits to Growth* at the Church.



And First Unitarian Universalist Society of Burlington will hold an Earth Day service on Sunday, April 23, at 10 a.m. featuring the FUUSB Climate Justice Team with Judy Brook. VTIPL leaders participated in the Third Act march and rally against "bad banks" on March 21 along with scores of other protests on the same day.

The march began and ended at Chase Bank at the top of Church Street Marketplace with several speakers and a ceremonial moment to cut up

credit cards issued by "bad banks". We were especially happy that the event coincided with the Vermont visit of national IPL President Rev. Susan Hendershot pictured here. Third Act reminds us that "the climate crisis is fueled by 'bad banks' loaning massive amounts of funds to the fossil fuel industry. The four largest offending banks are Chase, Citibank, Wells Fargo, and Bank of America." Many Vermonters have signed the Third Act pledge to no longer do business with the "bad banks". <u>Take the Pledge.</u>
