In honor of Harris, VTIPL will rename the "Ellie Cressey Webster Memorial Fund," named for Harris's late wife, to the "Ellie & Harris Webster Memorial Fund." These generous funds make possible some of the work that Harris and Ellie were most passionate about: enabling Vermont's faith and spiritual communities to reduce their greenhouse gas emissions, in response to a sacred and moral obligation to do everything we can to reduce our contribution to the climate crisis and to inspire and mobilize others to follow our example.

How do people of faith actively engage this moment of unraveling with open hearts, fierce spirits, and enduring care?



Envisioned by Vermont's own Bill McKibben, Sun Day is being promoted collaboratively by Third Act, Green Faith, Vermont Interfaith Power & Light, Sierra Club and other advocacy and religious groups. Rev. Jim Antal describes it as "a grassroots weekend of

action when millions of people across the United States will celebrate the gift and power of clean energy and the urgent need to stand up to the wealthy and well-connected who are doing everything they can to stand in its way."

To help congregations prepare for Sun Day, the Vermont Conference of the UCC is hosting a webinar that will feature Jim Antal as keynote speaker, joined by representatives of Vermont Interfaith Power & Light, who will share ideas and resources about how churches can get involved in renewable energy initiatives.

Again, the words of Jim Antal, "People of faith can and must play a key role, demonstrating... that the earth is our common home, that it is up to us to end the desecration of the sacred gift of creation, and that humanity is now called to embrace an urgent transition to clean energy."
